

APPENDIX 2

LISTED BUILDINGS & ANCIENT MONUMENTS

Listed Buildings

A building which is "Listed" is a building which is placed on a list by the Secretary of State for Scotland as being of special architectural or historic interest. Such buildings are subject to special controls. Listed Building Consent is required for any alteration, extension or other development which would affect the fabric or character of the building. These controls apply to both the interior and exterior of the building and buildings within the curtilage of a listed building, including boundary walls and railings.

There are three categories of Listed Buildings, namely A, B and C, and these are described as follows:

Category A:

Buildings of national or more than local importance, either architecturally or historically; or fine, little-altered examples of some particular period or style.

Category B:

Buildings of primarily local importance, or good examples of some period or style, but which may have been altered.

Category C:

Good buildings of any type or style, which may be considerably altered but yet retain elements of interest; and simple, often traditional buildings which group well with others in Categories A and B or are part of a planned group, eg an estate or an industrial complex.

Principles of Listing

In order to decide which buildings should be Listed, the following age criteria are used:-

- (a) All buildings erected prior to 1840 which are of any quality, even if plain, and survive in anything like their original form;
- (b) Buildings erection between 1840 and 1914 which are of definite quality and character, either individually or as part of a group;
- (c) Buildings erected between 1914 and 1945 if they are good examples of the work of an important architect, or of a particular style, whether it be traditional, progressive or international modern;
- (d) Post-1945 buildings which are at least 30 years old and of outstanding quality may be listed; a very high degree of selection is practised.

Besides age, particular attention is paid to:-

- (a) the principal works of better-known architects;
- (b) the special value of particular building types either for architectural or planning reasons, or as illustrating social and economic history, eg industrial buildings both urban and rural, railway and other transport buildings, schools, hospitals, theatres, civic buildings, markets, exchanges, charitable institutions, prisons, and public memorials;
- (c) technological innovation or virtuosity, eg cast or wrought-iron, prefabrication, early use of concrete;
- (d) distinctive regional variations in design, and use of materials;
- (e) association with well know persons or events;
- (f) group value; especially examples of town planning, eg squares, terraces, model villages; townscape and landscape value.

Section 253(1)(c) of the 1972 Act makes it clear that buildings owned by the Crown can be Listed.

When Listed Building Consent applications are received the advice of the Scottish Civic Trust and the Architectural Heritage Society for Scotland is sought. If proposals affect Category A or B buildings the Council must obtain the permission of the Secretary of State for Scotland before consent works can be issued.

At the present time there are in excess of 1300 Listed Buildings in Stirling district, with by far the largest proportion being in Stirling town, reflecting the number of Conservation Areas. (See Appendix 1). There are therefore too many to list in this Plan, and the reader is advised that information on any individual Building can be obtained from the Stirling Council Library Service or from offices of the Council.

Ancient Monuments

These are buildings, structures, and sites of national importance which are scheduled as Ancient Monuments by the Secretary of State for Scotland. It is an offence to carry out certain types of work affecting scheduled monuments without the prior written consent of the Secretary of State (referred to as "Scheduled Monument Consent"). Works requiring consent may be broadly taken to comprise demolishing, destroying, damaging, removing, repairing, altering, adding to, flooding or tipping onto, a Scheduled Monument. Included also are certain agricultural, horticultural and forestry works, namely sub-soiling, drainage works, the planting or uprooting of trees, hedges or shrubs, and any other works likely to disturb the soil below the maximum depth affected by normal ploughing. The use of metal detectors on protected sites is prohibited by law unless the Secretary of State's prior consent has been obtained. Similarly it is an offence to remove any objects discovered while using a detector.

There are a number of Scheduled Monuments which are also Listed Buildings. Anyone wishing to establish the full protected status of a particular site should check both the schedule below and the statutory lists of Listed Buildings held by Stirling Council.
