all interested in having the cemetery toilets opened on a permanent basis which
W. McDonald would provide for if he was allowed to run his monument
sculptures business from premises within the cemetery grounds.This meeting
ended with Mr McDonald agreeing to contact Stirling Council for planning
permission.

As the COMMUNITY COUNCIL had not been formally invited to attend , it was
agreed that the matter would only be considered once a planning consultation
had been sought be Stirling Council.
