

Logie Community Council 15th May 2006

The routine business meeting followed on directly from the AGM with Peter Philips as Chairman. The minutes of 20th March 2006 were proposed by B Jamieson, seconded by A Logan and approved.

Matters Arising

The Secretary spoke of a telephone conversation with Mr Brian Roberts regarding Speed Activated Signs. He is proposing a more irregular timetable of moving the signs from site to site 8-10 new sites, including Blairlogie West, are proposed for the autumn, if funding is secured. It was decided to ask Mr Roberts to speak at the September meeting.

The village footpath is technically uncompleted but looks in good order. The Chairman expressed his thanks to R Kelsall for managing this project.

George Sutherland and the Secretary are working on ideas for using the doomed oaks at Logie Crossroads.

Grants

After discussion it was agreed that money for notice boards or safety mirrors could be provided from ordinary CC funds. An appropriate way of improving local play parks was still unclear. Maybe this is Stirling Council's responsibility?

- 1) £1,000 would be given to the local gymnast Christopher Chalk.
- 2) Blairlogie Community & Heritage Trust would receive up to £1000 for stone repairs to the village roads eastern verge.
- 3) The remainder of our Area Community Planning Forum (cluster group) Grant, would be earmarked for the old road project. A Stirling Council Access Officer will be asked to come and discuss the project with us, provisionally August 23rd at 7.30pm. It was suggested that she be encouraged to walk the route prior to the meeting.

Multi Members Wards Pre Consultation

It was agreed that in principle Community Council boundaries should fit with the new wards, but that in our case removing one third of our community left the remainder very insular. Craigmill and Manor Powis would require to be asked their views formally. There was no local enthusiasm for Corporate Body Status or a Community Council Code of Conduct with sanctions.

A.O.C.B

There was disappointment that our Councillor Colin Finlay was not with us this evening, and concern that we therefore have no regular contact with Stirling Council.
