Here are some reasons why:


1. Some people leave and some join the school so the number of children in school can change.

"There will always be opportunities to meet up with your other friends too."



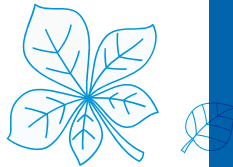
What will happen?

You will develop new leadership skills, be a good role model and a support to each other.

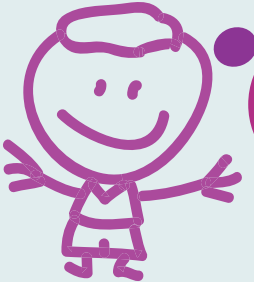


Further Support

"The teachers know what you have to learn whatever class you are in and help us to make other friends in the new class too."



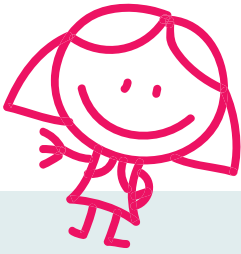
Moving class can be exciting. Remember, you are not alone!
