Title of Process	Impact of Big Noise on Pupil Attainment
Why does the Council process personal data?	<p>Personal data relating to individual pupil attainment is collected, moderated and analysed as part of the National Improvement Framework key driver - Assessment of Children's Progress.</p> <p>Anonymised personal data is processed to provide already held records in order to identify Big Noise participants enabling the Glasgow Centre for Population Health (GCPH) to perform statistical assessment of Big Noise Raploch's contribution to the educational attainment of participants.</p>
What personal data is used?	<p>Educational and demographic data held by Stirling Council and GCPH will be linked for Big Noise participants. At the same time Stirling Council will also incorporate the same educational and demographic data of a comparator group within the dataset. The comparator group will be from the Stirling Council region and reside in SIMD deciles 1 and 2.</p> <p>Identifiable variables shall be omitted as outlined in the Data Sharing Agreement between Stirling Council and Glasgow Centre for Population Health for the transfer of personal data regarding the evaluation of Big Noise Raploch.</p> <p>The data being shared by GCPH to facilitate linkage will be Name, date of birth and postcode. Once records have been linked, these identifiable variables will be deleted.</p>

	<p>Pupil data being shared by Stirling Council:</p> <p>Insight Tariff points, Insight Leaver destination, SIMD quintiles, deciles, vigintiles, ethnicity and English as Additional Language.</p>
What makes it lawful for the Council to process this personal data?	<p>We process personal data in order to comply with statutory obligations relating to education, and to perform a “public task” in the public interest.</p>
Where does the Council obtain personal data from?	<p>The pupil data set shall be populated from Seemis-held pupil data and Insight pupil leaver data.</p> <p>Insight leaver data is compiled by Scottish Government and accessed by Stirling Council. There is a data sharing agreement in place with Stirling Council for Insight.</p>
Where does the Council keep personal data?	<p>Seemis securely holds the individual personal data accessed by schools and local authority. Downloaded Seemis Insight data is saved on the Stirling Council secure network.</p>
How long does the Council keep personal data?	<p>The personal data is stored and accessed in Seemis for the duration of the pupil’s academic career from Nursery – S6.</p> <p>The personal data collected from Seemis for the ‘Impact of Big Noise’ will be used so that the impact analysis can be continued on an ongoing basis until project completion.</p>
Who does the Council share personal data with?	<p>Glasgow Centre for Population Health.</p>
