

## **Stirling District Council**

### **Places of Public Entertainment**

Stirling District Council, the Licensing Authority for the District in terms of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 intended to make a resolution in the following terms:-

“Stirling District Council resolve that as from 1 October 1993 any activity falling within any of the classes of activity listed below when intended to be held in any place falling within any of the classes of place listed below shall require to be licensed in terms of Section 41 (Public Entertainment Licences) of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 and shall be regulated by the relevant provisions of said Act: This resolution is made in relation to the whole of Stirling District, being the whole area of the licensing authority:-

#### **Classes of Activity**

1. Discos, Dances, Roller-Discos, Videotheques, Raves, Acid-House Parties, Techno-Dance Theatres.
2. Concerts
3. Displays
4. Demonstrations
5. Billiards and Snooker
6. Sporting Events
7. Fun Fairs
8. Circuses
9. Bowling
10. Skating
11. Swimming
12. Paint Ball Games and War Games
13. Bungee Jumping

#### **Classes of Place**

1. Halls, Dance-Halls, Discotheques
2. Proprietary Clubs
3. Members Clubs
4. Barns and other Agricultural premises
5. Marquees and other temporary erections
6. Bowling Rinks
7. Skating Rinks
8. Billiard/Snooker Halls
9. Swimming Pools
10. Warehouses

11. Indoor Shopping Centres, Arcades and Malls
12. Factories and other Industrial premises
13. Parks and other Open Spaces
14. Fields and Grazings
15. Athletic and Sports Grounds, while not being used as such
16. Educational establishments, while not being used as such
17. Premises belonging to or occupied by any religious body, while not being used wholly or mainly for purposes connected with that body
18. Premises in respect of which there is a permit under Section 16 of the Lotteries and Amusements Act 1976 or any replacement or amending legislative provision, while not being used in pursuance of the permit
19. Licensed premises within the meaning of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 1976 or any replacement or amending legislation provision in which Public Entertainment is being provided outwith the permitted hours within the meaning of that Act
20. Bridges, Aqueducts and Overpasses
21. Streets and Roads
22. Car Parks

With effect from 1 October 1993, the previous resolution of the Council dated 1 September 1983, relating to Public Entertainment Licences is rescinded.”
